¹⁴ For the body does not consist of one member but of many. ¹⁵ If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁶ And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁷ If the whole body were an eye, where would be the sense of hearing? If the whole body were an ear, where would be the sense of smell? ¹⁸ But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. ¹⁹ If all were a single member, where would the body be? ²⁰ As it is, there are many parts, yet one body.

²¹ The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you."

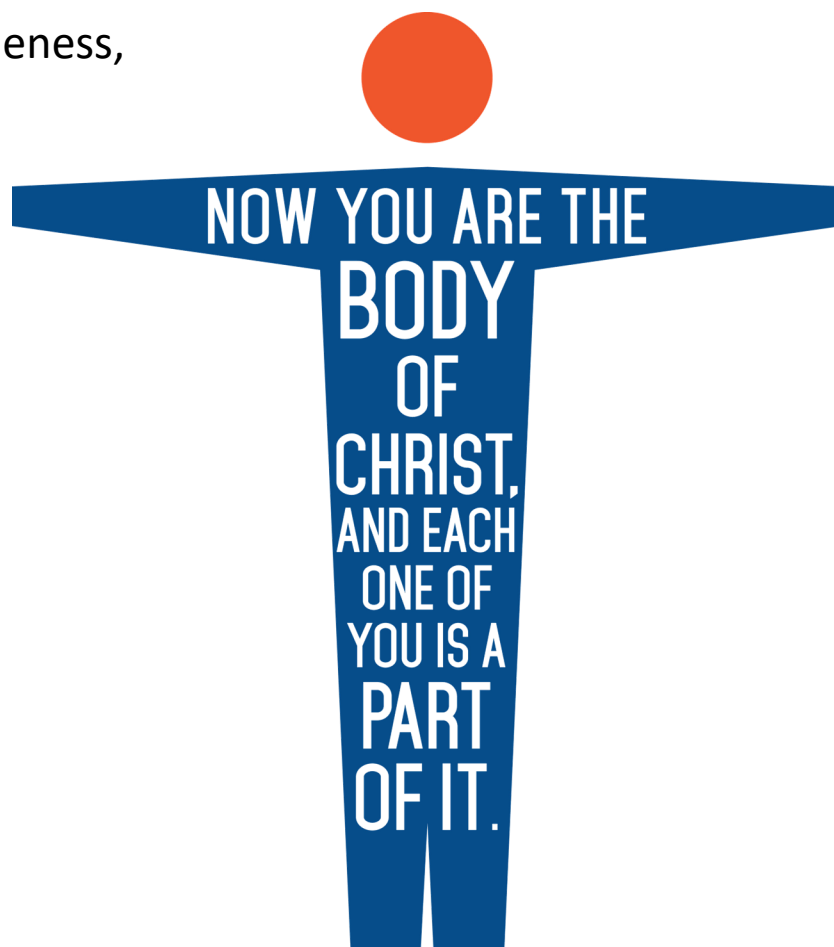

The Lord Will Pour Out His Spirit

“And it will come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions. Even on the male and female servants in those days I will pour out my spirit.” Joel 2:28-29 ESV

I read a donation to our library called *“Inside the Revolution”* by Joel Rosenberg. Perhaps it captured my attention because I was in my mid 20’s when some of these events started to unfold in 1979 and I recognized names and places and events. Now over 46 years later these events are back in the headlines. Here is a brief summary from Joel’s introduction about this, not one, but three revolutions transpiring in the Middle East.

Thirty years after the rise of the Ayatollah Khomeini to power in Iran, it has become clear to me that there is not simply one Revolution under way; there are three. Each is pursued with equal passion and vigor by groups I define as the “Radicals,” the “Reformers,” and the “Revivalists.” And with the stakes so high—and the time so short—there are important questions to be answered, and fast.

How, for example, can citizens and leaders in the West properly understand and counter the threat Islamic Radicals pose to Judeo-Christian civilization? How can we understand what is really going on inside the minds of the Radicals? When they read the Qur’an what verses drive them to rob, kill, and destroy? Is there any way to persuade them to not carry out their apocalyptic agendas? Diplomacy has not worked so far, but might direct negotiations at the highest possible level—president to president—work? Or is that a fool’s errand?

At the same time, are there any Muslim leaders pushing back against the jihadists? Are there any leaders who think the Radicals are crazy and dangerous and who are willing to say so? If so, who are they? What verses in the Qur’an do these Reformers point to in making their case that Islam is a “religion of peace”? What are their personal stories? How did they climb to power, and why don’t we hear more about them in the media? Do such Reformers really have any chance at remaking the modern Middle East and winning the war of ideas—as well as the war of bullets and bombs—with the Radicals?

What's more, are war and politics the only prescriptions for what ails the people of the Middle East today? Are there any sources of true hope? Is Christianity really dying out in the lands of its birth, as many claim, or is it true that more Muslims are coming to faith in Jesus Christ today than at any other time in history? Is there any evidence that Christianity is surging in the epicenter? Who are the Revivalists, and what is the message of spiritual hope and change they are trying to spread? And if Muslims are converting to Christianity in record numbers as some have suggested, what are the implications of this trend for the Church in the West and around the world?

I found this book to be very enlightening and hopeful especially at a time when so many current events appear to be terrifying like wars and rumors of wars, nuclear weapons of destruction, terrorism, revolts, killing, poverty and the list goes on. I highly recommend Joel's book. He has done much research, interviewed some amazing folks with incredible stories and experiences, and presents the information in a very easy to read style.

Asia

Disciple-Making Movements & New Communities

Across South Asia, **five new disciple-making movements** were launched in 2025. Through these movements, **41 new disciples** were formed and **three new redemptive communities** emerged in previously unreached villages and urban neighborhoods. Families are now gathering regularly—often under trees or in simple homes—to worship, pray, and walk in obedience-based discipleship.

In December 2025 alone, our Asia Team trained **more than 500 leaders** in evangelism and disciple-making, significantly strengthening the long-term capacity of local churches and movements.

Training, Missions & Regional Expansion

In India, Malaysia, and Indonesia, leaders were trained through Keystone Project workshops and seminars, resulting in the formation of new mission teams reaching neighboring nations. Across Southeast Asia, **over 700 leaders** were equipped—including one woman over 60 years old who has committed to serve as a missionary in Indonesia beginning in 2026.

Stories of Transformation

We witnessed God raise up leaders like *Raja*, a disciple from an unreached mountain village who stepped forward to lead when his mentor was forced to leave. Raja trained new leaders, reached a neighboring unreached village, and helped establish a new redemptive community.

We also saw the courageous faith of *Rahul*, a 15-year-old disciple who, despite hardship and opposition at home, boldly chose to follow Jesus. Today, he testifies that the church has become his true family.

Africa

From One Family to a Growing Fellowship

In the village of Ongino, God began something small—and deeply powerful. In 2024, a single family encountered Christ and surrendered their lives to Him. What followed was not a program, but a movement. That family opened their home, and soon a fellowship was born.

Today, members of the community gather weekly under a tree to open the Scriptures, worship together, and share the Gospel. What began with one household has become a redemptive community marked by faith, unity, and obedience.

Children Sharing the Gospel

One of the most moving moments of the year came through children. After being trained to share the Gospel, a group of children boldly entered a nearby community. With simple words and sincere faith, they shared the message of Jesus.

That day, **14 people—including adults—gave their lives to Christ**. These children are learning early that they are not just future leaders—they are disciples today.

Shepherding Through Service

Beyond preaching, ministry leaders embraced holistic shepherding—walking alongside families through practical care, consistent presence, and faithful Gospel witness. As trust was built, hearts opened to the message of Christ.

Reaching the Multitudes

In partnership with Global Outreach, believers were sent out two by two across Africa. Through these efforts:

- **19,100 people heard the Gospel**
- **5,641 people surrendered their lives to Jesus**

Outreach took place through crusades and open-air meetings, as well as in schools, prisons, children's remand homes, trading centers, and local communities across the region.

Looking Ahead to 2026

We enter 2026 with faith and expectation for what God will do next. With your continued partnership, we plan to:

- Train mission teams within the domestic church to reach the unreached in the United States
- Strengthen alumni coaching and regional disciple-making hubs
- Publish and distribute **The Keystone Project Manual** globally
- Produce additional digital discipleship resources, podcasts, and missional teaching
- Equip even more leaders to reach the unreached with the Gospel

We believe 2026 will be a year of multiplication—more teams, more movements, and more disciples of Jesus among the nations.

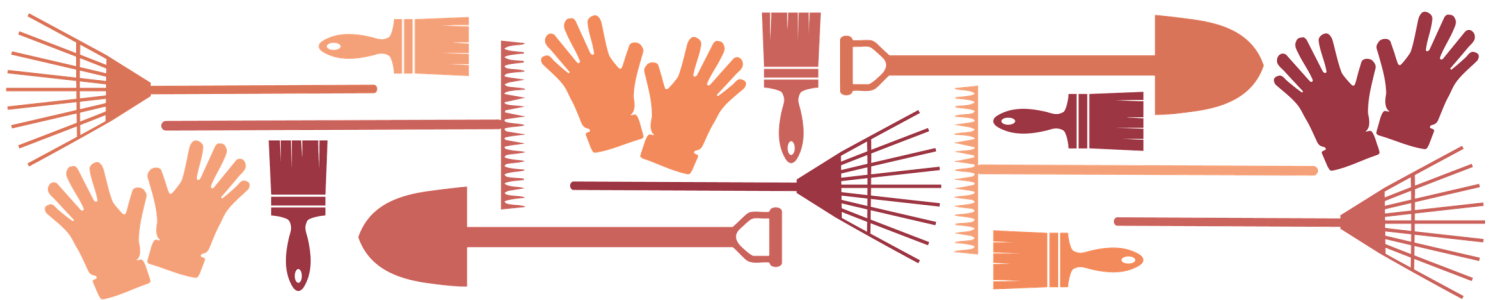
When approved they will be placed on the board for LWC members to review (names will be kept confidential).
