have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, which he lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight making known to us the mystery of his will, according to his purpose, which he set forth in Christ as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in Christ, things in heaven and things on earth in him." Let us all seek to shed the lens that has any earthly ties and look at the world through a biblical lens. My hope is that we all obtain a life free in Christ, learning to walk in step with the very Spirit that dwells within us.

#### From the Pastor's Desk

## **Great Opportunity, Great Commission!**

Pastor Ben is teaching a series on the "Normal Christian Life". One of these messages will be "Our Commission". I had started this article before I saw his messages series so I am still writing. Perhaps this will "prime the pump" of your thinking and meditation.

The Great Commission is a powerful, final, sending message from Jesus to His followers.

Matthew 28:18-20 reads: And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in[a] the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

It appears Jesus gave this message just prior to ascension so these are some of Jesus' last directions to his disciples. Since the disciples were commissioned to begin this world evangelization and the formation of the Church, most believers see these as commissioning word to the Church and all believers. In a few weeks the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit would come and the outworking of this command would begin.

Several things to note. The command/commission flows out of Christ's authority as creator and redeemer of humanity. The very Son of God is giving all his followers directions for their life as a follower/disciple. The core of this command is "make disciples". This is accomplished by telling the message of the good news or gospel of Jesus Christ. His death is for our forgiveness and salvation. This message is for everyone to hear, and every believer to carry out. Every time I read these words I recognize how I fall short. I want to learn from the model of Jesus. He didn't grab every person on the road and compel them to believe in him as Messiah, but he was always aware of where his Father, by the leading of the Spirit, was guiding him to speak and act. Wouldn't it be great if we all did this? We wouldn't all do it the same, but we coud all be led by the Spirit in this way. Just Peter didn't speak in the same way that Matther or John did or even later the apostle Paul, but they all took the message and made disciples.

#### From the Pastor's Desk

Since we are to "make disciples" this implies not just bringing them to believe in Jesus for salvation, but then "baptizing them" and "teaching them to obey" the full message of Jesus. When we learn more about spiritual gifts we recognize some have special abilities, spiritual gifts, at helping people come to faith and others are gifted at teaching and training these new believers to grow and obey all the teachings of Jesus. Together the Spirit uses followers to transform the world.

We should also note that the words "Go and make disciples" might best be translated "as you are going, continue this task to make disciples". This task/opportunity isn't just for missionaries, but for every one of us, in the daily course of life, to be actively making disciples. This begs the question, who am I discipling? I should be. If I claim to be a redeemed daughter or son of God I should have someone I am helping to know Jesus better, trust him more completely and obey him more joyously. LWC needs more faithful disciples who are making disciples. Will you join in?



#### Whose House IS This?

(Much has happened this summer, which has left me with a great many concerns for the people I care about. It has become obvious to me that I cannot fit all of my thoughts into one article. So, this will be the first of several . . .)

When we are troubled about something, we are encouraged to ask for help. To approach a trusted friend or confidante, hoping they can help us sort out the problem. Or, to seek godly counsel from a pastor or other mature Christian whom we admire.

We know it is okay to do that . . . but when does seeking godly counsel become something ugly?

As I prepared to write this month's article, I felt a strong conviction in my spirit. In my efforts to seek comfort over a family issue, I had crossed the line --- I had begun to gossip . . .

In early July, my husband Richard needed to make a trip to Minnesota. His father was dealing with some serious health issues, and Rich strongly felt that he should be there. Normally, I would go with him, but my schedule demanded that I stay here. It's a good thing we listened to that . . .

What was expected to be a few days became nearly three weeks. I fully supported Rich's need to be there, even though I was an emotional basket case! Not because he was gone . . . but because of family conflicts he would face there.

Rich's dad, and all four of his siblings, have a good relationship with Richard. Sadly, they do NOT have that with each other. There is so much hatred and bitterness between them, it breaks my heart to think about. Consequently, I allowed my sorrow and frustration to lead me into a place of sinful disobedience over the whole thing.

Specifically, I was rebellious to all that the Bible says about forgiveness, kindness, building up our neighbors, or using my tongue unwisely. Every time someone asked me how Rich's dad was doing, or how things were going there, I began to cry. Those tears were drenched in frustration and anger, over the way Rich's family members treat each other.

So, I would go off on a long tirade about everything THEY were doing wrong. Giving almost NO thought to how judgmental and gossipy <u>I</u> was being. I shared my angry thoughts with anyone who was willing to listen. I may have even made it sound **worse** each time I talked about it.

In each case, my comments were based on MY feelings. On things I had seen or heard . . . from each individual, about the others. I had no true inside information. No "other side of the story" to balance against what I had already heard. Only *pieces* of the puzzle, which I had heard from each person, one at a time, or had seen each person do.

Worst of all, NONE of them were here to speak for themselves. To respond to my diatribe or explain their actions. I was talking behind their backs. I had never shared my frustrations with *them* at all. Never given *any* of them the chance to share *their* side of the story.

Exodus 20:16 tells us, "Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor."

Even if what I was saying WAS true, is it FULLY Truth if I don't know the whole story? Did I honor God in the way I handled my feelings? I don't think so. I shared those frustrations with EVERYONE but the people involved.

**Matthew** 18:15 tells us, "If thy brother shall trespass against thee, go and tell him his fault between thee and him alone."

It doesn't tell me to share it with half of the people I know *first*; to get *them* all stirred up about it before I've ever even talked to my brother! It doesn't tell me to recruit other people to join my anger and share in it with me. It tells me to talk to the person with whom I am upset — FIRST! And to talk to him alone.

Couldn't I apply this same guideline to anything I may have heard ABOUT someone, from somebody else?

Then, God reminded me of what we read in John 8:7, when the scribes and Pharisees bring the adulteress before Jesus. After hearing their complaint, He tells them, "He that is without sin among you, let him first cast a stone at her."

I am certainly in no position to be casting stones at other people. It is not my place to judge --- especially when I don't know all the facts. And, in casting judgment --- through conversations with everyone **else** --- have I not lapsed into **gossip** also? May God forgive me, I am guilty of such sins regarding my in-laws.

On top of all that, there was one more sad truth. I had spent those three weeks saying things **about** my in-laws --- to **other** people --- that I would **not** want my husband to hear me say.

The list of Biblical infractions goes on and on. The Bible has a LOT to say about gossip, judging others, and using our tongues unwisely. About forgiveness and kindness. I won't go into them, because I didn't bring this up to launch a Bible Study. I shared my summer frustrations so I could help us all take a good look in the mirror. Here, at the Little White Church, **we are** a family. A group of people from an assortment of places and backgrounds. Our pastors, elders, deacons, and deaconesses are a huge part of that family. An **important** part of that family.

But they are *not* the HEAD of the family. **God** is! *None* of us is qualified to be the patriarch or matriarch of our little church family. When there are choices and decisions to be made, we know where to go . . . to God. Jesus left His Holy Spirit here, to guide, teach, and encourage us. When we need to know God's thoughts on something, He left us the Holy Bible, to show us the way.

We love the little church home that we share . . . where we gather to worship each Sunday. But it is **not** OUR house! It is **God's** house. A place **He** has provided, where believers have been gathering since 1889. **We** are commanded to conduct ourselves, here, in a way which glorifies **Him**.

Isn't it time we all start LIVING the Word we study on Sundays? *Acting* like we KNOW **Whose** House this is . . . and put HIM back in charge of ALL our family business?


His prayer: "Bend down and listen to me; rescue me quickly. Be for me a great rock of safety, a fortress where my enemies cannot reach me. You are my rock and my fortress. For the honor of Your name, lead me out of this peril. Pull me from the trap my enemies set for me, for I find protection in You alone." Ps. 31:2-4 New Living Translation

These physical rocks of safety were not the only hiding places David wrote about. In Psalm 32 he expressed his joy at the forgiveness of the LORD. He compared the joy and relief of forgiveness to the safety of be-

ing in those caves in the rocks.

Married in 1961, to my first wife at too young of an age, I had two sons Jeff and Jason, and was divorced 17 years later.

I met my current and last Bride Mary in 1976. Starting in 1979, I lived with her for 8 years before we recorded our marriage. We moved to South Dakota in 1988.



My business career, started at

the age of 20 in the life insurance business. I then added other types of businesses. I did have a fun job as a commercial pilot flying a fleet of Hot Air Balloons for the Coca-Cola Bottling Company for about three years.






Books included in this year's study: Ezekiel, Daniel, Ezra, Esther, Haggai, Zechariah, Nehemiah, and Malachi.
